

The questionnaire had a return of 38% from residents, giving a good level of confidence that it is representative of the views of the three communities' .



Question 1 asked if residents were aware of a range of issues along with the lack of a specific evacuation plan.
 58% said they were not aware of these issues
 40% said they were aware of the issues.

Question 2 enquired if residents were aware that decommissioning was not just a Fairbourne problem.
 68% said yes, they were aware that it was not just a Fairbourne issue.

Question 3 queried if residents felt they had received adequate communication regarding the future for Fairbourne from Gwynedd Council and the Welsh Government.
 An overwhelming 94% felt that communication had been inadequate.

Question 4 requested a mandate for the Community to be represented by the ACC and the FMFPB,
 An overwhelming 96.5% wanted to be represented by the ACC & FMFPB*

Question 5 asked “Would you prefer to represent yourself?”
 88% replied No



Question 6 enquired if people were happy to rely on Gwynedd Council, in the event of decommissioning, to place residents and their families into any accommodation available.
 94% replied that they were **not** happy for GCC to place them in any accommodation available regardless of type and location

Question 7 asked if people were aware that the Shoreline Management Plan 2 (SMP2) is undergoing a “refresh”. Communities are not invited to submit any information that they deem to be of importance.
 16% said yes, they were aware of this but those saying no, they were not aware of this - totalled 83.5%

Question 8 requested residents to grade their preferred options in the case of abandonment:
 50% of respondents had a time extension as their preferred first option.
 42% wanted compensation for their property as a preferred first option
 11% had housing in like for like accommodation as a first preference.
